# Why now?

- As we transition to the next period of fisheries CLLD, the COVID-19 pandemic has demonstrated the importance of **building local communities and economies that are resilient to short-term shocks and long-term changes.**
  - This will mean ‘thinking out of the box.’ to find new, innovative ways of addressing emerging local needs as well as those persistent needs that top-down policy responses have not been able to solve.
  - ‘One size doesn’t fit all.’ FLAGs must **focus their efforts** and identify and support the best projects for their community's specific needs; projects with quality.

# What do we mean by 'quality?'

- By 'quality local projects,' we are referring to projects that make a real difference to an area and its local community members.



# What do we mean by 'quality?'

- Good local projects should:
  - **Respond to a real need at local level**
    - Including specific groups and/or individuals
    - They should be inclusive and have an impact on the area as a whole

# What do we mean by 'quality?'

- Good local projects should:
  - **Build on local resources**
    - Including an area's natural resources
    - But also, its human resources and their capacities

# What do we mean by 'quality?'

- Good local projects should:
  - **Bring about change**
    - To the local economy
    - To the environment
    - To the capacities and abilities of the local community
    - To the well-being and self-fulfilment of community members

# What do we mean by 'quality?'

- Good local projects should:
  - **Contribute to long-term improvements**
    - Not only be a short-term fix
    - Have longevity and create sustainable positive change
    - Be innovative and develop new ways of thinking

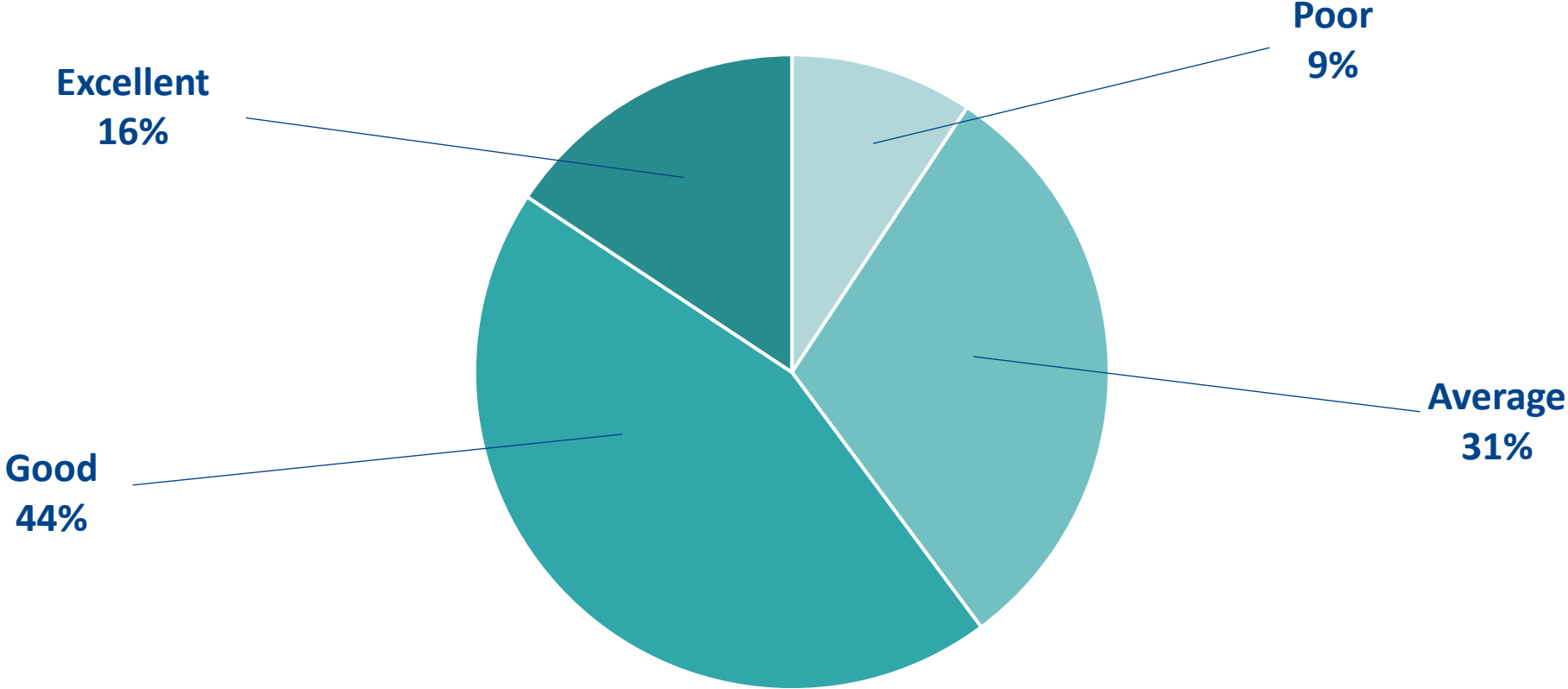
# What do we mean by 'quality?'

- Good local projects should:
  - **Offer value for money**
    - Strong justification for selection
    - Justifying the investment of public money
    - Have a broad impact

# What do we mean by 'quality?'

- Good local projects should:
  - **Complement other local projects**
    - Building synergies is important
    - Cooperation between projects
    - Feed into wider objectives and bigger vision for the area
    - Develop new opportunities and ideas
