Project selection process

1. Appointment with the potential project promoter
2. Project summary (« *fiche action* »)
3. Check against the FLAG's strategy
4. Project adjustments, if necessary
5. Check of all eligibility requirements
6. Technical evaluation of the project (FLAG Manager)
7. Selection committee. Presentation of the project by the candidate.
8. Vote by FLAG board (show of hands)

Evaluation form

- Evaluation form completed by the FLAG Manager and sent to the members 10 days before the committee
=> To allow time to prepare questions

Evaluation form (selection criteria 1)

Does it bring innovation to the area? (technical, social, community, methodological)			
Does it involve innovations that can be transferred to other areas?			
Can the project serve as an example/ be replicated by others?			
does the project create or maintain jobs in the area?

What are the direct and indirect spinoffs of the project?			
Is the timeline realistic?			
Is the budget realistic and value for money ?			
Does the project promoter have the necessary capacity and will the project be sustained in time?
