#### Marine litter: the challenge





Health concerns



Degradation of marine ecosystems (13 billion Euros a year)



Impact on fisheries and aquaculture (1-5% of total fleet revenue) and ports/shipping



Tourism and coastal communities ( $\approx$  630 million euros)







### Commitments in the Plastics Strategy



"A legislative initiative on single-use plastics at EU level still to be tabled by this Commission"



"Approach used for light-weight plastic bags"



"The Commission will also develop targeted measures for reducing the loss or abandonment of fishing gear at sea"

### **Objective**




Curb the negative economic and environmental impacts
arising from littering of single use plastics and from
abandoned fishing gear

 Significant reduction of littering while creating economic opportunities and protecting the environment



### Most found marine litter items on European beaches



- 70% covered of all marine litter: top 10 SUP (43%) + fishing gear (27%)

#### ! NOT against plastics



Measures to facilitate **prevention**, **re-use**, **collection and recovery** of:

- single-use items that are wholly or partially made of plastics, which are major contributors to marine litter
- fishing gear wholly or partially made of plastics





<u>Definition of plastic</u>: Polymer as defined in REACH with the exception of natural polymers that have not been chemically modified



### **Separate collection**



• 90% separate collection target for plastic beverage bottles How? inter alia, by Deposit Refund Systems and targets for EPR





Supporting high quality recyclates and uptake of secondary raw materials

### Waste management measures



### Extended producer responsibility



- Single-use plastic products (that are not subject to market ban) and fishing gear
- Financial responsibility of producers



- collection and subsequent treatment of waste (existing obligation for packaging)
- clean-up of litter
- awareness raising (existing obligation for packaging)



- Consistent and building on the minimum requirements for EPR schemes as in the Waste Framework Directive
- Member States to establish specific EPR scheme objectives, including the level of ambition for clean-up activities



### Fishing gear - need for action



ALDFG (abandoned, lost and discarded fishing gear) represents around 27% of marine litter items: equivalent of over 11,000 tons per year



not single use, it is supposed to be durable in the marine and has no alternatives



high recycling potential – but the current recycling market is rather small and much localised



complementarity and coherence with EU legislation, Plastic Strategy and parallel COM proposals (Fisheries Control Regulation; Port reception facilities directive)

### Fishing gear - Measures





### **Proposed measure:**


**EXTENDED PRODUCER RESPONSIBILITY for producers of fishing gear containing plastics** 

### Improve the circularity of fishing gear:

- maximise collection
- facilitate re-use
- support high quality recycling

#### ----- Producers will cover the costs of:

- collection, transport, treatment
- awareness raising measures





### **Port Reception Facilities directive**

- currently under revision
- complementarity with our SUP proposal

### **Requirements:**

- MS should set up adequate port reception facilities
- requirement on all ships, including fishing vessels and recreational craft, to deliver all their waste before departure
- introduction of 100 % indirect fee
- passively fished waste included in the scope

EPR schemes for fishing gear should support the proposed indirect fee system – help avoid any increase in the fee and ensure a right of delivery.
