Clarifications n°02 following the publication of the Call for Proposals

QUESTIONS	ANSWERS
<p>Q1. I need clarification on the date for the submission of expression of interest to attend the info sessions on the Call for Proposals</p> <p>AND</p> <p>Q2. Which address shall we use for further inquiries and clarifications?</p>	<p>A1 and A2. Four info sessions (one per District) have been conducted in the capital town of the concerned Districts between the 13th and the 24th of May 2019 as forecasted on pages 2 and 21 of the published Guidelines. The deadline for the submission of expression of interest to attend the information session was the 6th of May 2019. However, the information shared during the info sessions is based on the Guidelines. In case of need for further clarification, you can send an e-mail to the functional box of the delegation (delegation-sierra-leone-cfp@eeas.europa.eu) no later than 21 days before the deadline for the submission of applications.</p>
<p>Q3. Kambia has three priority areas namely: Infrastructure, Energy and Agriculture. For infrastructure does EU expect us to develop a proposal on an infrastructure project that will involve constructing local court (court barray), markets and feeder roads construction geared towards supporting Kambia Local Council?</p> <p>AND</p> <p>Q4. Should the potential project be designed to support the local council in revenue collection?</p>	<p>A3 and A4. Applicants are primarily expected to develop proposals that fall under the specific objective and priorities described under paragraph 1.2 of the published Guidelines. Actions can be inspired by the non-exhaustive list included in the same paragraph but should in any case be designed to contribute strictly to the specific objective and priorities of the Call with regards the specific lots.</p> <p>Further to this paragraph 1.2 of the published Guidelines states that actions should contribute to the implementation of District Development Plans' priorities.</p>
<p>Q5. Section 2.2 of the template for the full application form - Annex A2. Grant application form- is titled "Lead Applicant's Experience". In previous full application forms in other calls for proposals this section was titled "Experience" and applicants could include experience from lead and co-applicants. In the template for the current call is it possible to include the experience of the lead and co-applicants or should we only include experience of the lead applicant?</p>	<p>A5. It is possible to include the experience of lead, co-applicants and affiliated entities in section 2.2, following the templates (i) and (ii) of the same section, that permit to specify if the described experience is referred to the lead, a co-applicant or an affiliated entity.</p>

<p>Q6. Is it a must to have an INGO as co-applicant or local CSOs and NGOs can team up for this call?</p>	<p>A6. As stated under point 2.1.1 of the published Guidelines, any local CSO and NGO that satisfy all the eligibility criteria can submit its application under this Call for Proposals. The lead applicants must act with co-applicants (02 to 05) that should satisfy the same eligibility criteria as the lead. Only INGOs are bound to apply together with at least one Sierra Leonean organization. This is not valid vice-versa: Sierra Leonean organizations are not obliged to have INGOs as co-applicants.</p>
